In the Classroom...

Class work, Homework, Late work, & Make-up work.

- → Class work will be given with a focus on the AVID standards, Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization & Reading. Much of the focus of the AVID 12 curriculum centers on college admission applications, essays & financial aid.
- → Students will be required to apply to at least 6 universities.

 The application process will take place both inside and outside of the classroom. Other homework assignments will include other pieces of the college application process such as scholarship applications, letter(s) of recommendation, etc.
- → Students in AVID should show responsibility in turning in their work on time. No late work will be accepted.
- → Missing AVID is not ideal. Most of the in-class assignments are not replicable. Absent students will be given an alternative make-up work assignment. Make-up assignments need to be

turned in within a week of return. It is YOUR responsibility to get your make-up/homework assignment(s). I will not seek you out to give it to you. The procedure for getting make-up work is as follows:

- ⇒ Make-up work and attached handouts will be available on the website. See the AVID page.
- ⇒ See Mrs. Murphy for clarification on assignments before or after class.
